About Mathilde Jane Gutow



Mathilde Jane Landesman was born in
Cleveland on February 23, 1919, and raised in an
orphanage and foster care until she turned 16.
She graduated from Cleveland Heights High
School in 1937 and worked as a Deputy Auditor
for Mahoning County.

In 1943, Jane joined the Women's Army Corps, serving in New Guinea and the Philippines as an auditor, stenographer, and artist. She received several honors, including two Bronze Battle Stars and a Victory Medal.

After her military service, Jane earned a bachelor's degree in physiology from Cleveland College of Western Reserve University in 1948 and worked as a social worker. She later obtained a teaching certificate in 1965 and a master's degree from Case Western University in 1971. She worked as a teacher and was active in adult literacy programs at the Cleveland Public Library.

Despite physical disabilities, Jane was a voracious reader, skilled artist, and Girl Scout leader. The Mathilde Jane Gutow Endowed Scholarship, funded by her daughter and sonin-law, Marsha and Thomas Hopkins, honors her memory and offers Cleveland State University students who have aged out of the foster care system the opportunity to follow her example and live meaningful and satisfying lives.

Mathilde Jane Gutow Scholarship Requirements

Eligibility:

- A GPA of 2.5 or Higher
- touched by or aged out of the foster care system
- · Maintain minimum of 6 credits

Responsibilities:

- Participate in scheduled Pratt Center – Fostering Success and Leadership Program activities, events and programs.
- Maintain an overall 2.5 Grade Point Average, or higher.
- Attend all classes and complete all course requirements
