Key Features of the Inquiry Core Curriculum

Minimum 37 credit hours, aligned with ODHE's OT-36 Program

All courses designed with an inquiry orientation to spark curiosity and develop critical inquiry skills

All courses designed to develop and assess specific core competencies

Assessment through Signature Work, combining authentic assessment and learning reflection

Inquiry Pathways uniting courses under shared themes

Writing & Speaking Across the Curriculum

2 Required Courses

At least 1 must be WAC

WAC/SPAC Courses are distinct from Core Courses

- Goal is to develop advanced, discipline specific writing skills
- At least 1 course must be discipline specific and *not* the major capstone

Policy Change is Retroactive

• Starting Fall '25, GenEd08 students will also only need to complete 2 total courses

Summary of Big Changes

GenEd08	Inquiry Core Curriculum
1-ch "Intro to University Life"	3-ch "Inquiry Launch"
Required 2 Math/Quantitative Literacy courses	Requires 1 "Quantitative & Formal Reasoning" course, permits a 2 nd to count
Arts & Humanities/Social Science courses had to come from "two different departments"	No such restriction on completion
ALAAME requirement applied to one Arts & Humanities or Social Science course	"ALAAME" content embedded in specific "Global Human Perspectives" requirement





Summary of Big Changes

GenEd08	Inquiry Core Curriculum
Capstone	Capstones are not required in Core. Majors/programs may drop capstone requirements. There will be more flexibility around capstone requirements for GenEd08 students
3 required WAC/SPAC, 1 in major	 2 required WAC/SPAC, 1 in major and not capstone WAC/SPAC Courses are distinct from the Core Goal is to develop advanced, discipline specific writing skills

Current students — managing the transition

Can GenEd08 students move to the Core?

- Yes! They can if it benefits them
 - Submit a Fast Track petition
- Students can request a change to gen ed catalog rights only.
 Major catalog rights do not have to change
- We may find groups of students for which this change should be made in bulk. Likely to be major- or collegespecific – stay tuned





Current students — managing the transition

Many policy changes can be applied retroactively to GenEd08 students

- WAC/SPAC reduction (will be programmed in Degree Audit)
- No longer need two departments for AH/SS (will be programmed in Degree Audit)
- No QL limitation for Math/QL (will be programmed in Degree Audit)
- Capstone flexibility (AdCom required)

Will Degree Audit be programmed for all these changes?

- Yes, main Core requirements will be programmed by the time registration opens March 10
- Reprogramming for changes that impact GenEd08 will take place early in the Summer semester





Current students — managing the transition

Can GenEd08 students take Core classes and vice versa?

- Yes! A lot of GenEd08 classes, if taken before Fall 25, will count towards Core
- Similarly, Core classes will count for GenEd08 in aligned categories

How will I know which classes can count where?

- Core Curriculum and GenEd08 webpages will contain lists of approved courses in each category
- CampusNet Class Search will include Core and GenEd08 designations
- Courses will be programmed in the applicable categories in Degree Audit

DRAFT_KN_Transfer students — managing the transition

Since Core Curriculum course categories align closely with GenEd08 (and OT36), current Transfer Credit Evaluation (TCE) course codes will not change

• Code descriptions <u>will</u> change e.g. AH 100 will be renamed Human Culture and creativity. ANHW 100 will be renamed Global Human Perspectives

Transfer guides are being updated and <u>both</u> Core Curriculum and GenEd08 guides will be available

Catalog rights for transfer students

- New transfer admits can elect to follow GenEd08 catalog rights, if they have been following a transfer pathway or articulation agreement
- This option will remain in place for two years, from Fall 25 to Sum 27

- Removal of GenEd08 approval
- Removal of courses from the Course catalog
