LINDA M. QUINN, PhD, was elected as the Faculty Representative to the Cleveland State University Board of Trustees by the Faculty Senate for a one-year term ending June 30, 2025, and then was re-elected for a second one-year term ending June 30, 2026.

Dr. Quinn is a professor of practice in the mathematics and statistics department in the College of Arts and Sciences. Her teaching areas include both undergraduate and graduate courses in statistical consulting, design and analysis of experiments, applied regression models, sampling and survey design.

She is professionally affiliated with the American Statistical Association, Mu Sigma Rho Statistics honors Society, MidWest SAS Users Group, and Pi Mu Epsilon Mathematics Honors Society. Dr. Quinn has received recognition at CSU through the Golden Apple Award, Distinguished Faculty Award for Service and Teaching, and the Jearl Walker Outstanding Teaching Award.

Dr. Quinn's professional experience includes roles with QED Industries, Inc. University Hospitals-CWRU-Cleveland Veterans Affairs, AcroMed, Center for Regional Economic Issues at CWRU, Cleveland Research Institute at St. Vincent Charity Hospital, and American Greetings.

She earned her Ph.D. in Urban Education—Leadership from Cleveland State University, and three M.S. degrees in Applied Statistics, Computer Science (Bowling Green State University) and Operations Research (Case Western Reserve University).
